RESULTS OF EU FUNDING IN THE AREA OF PROTECTION

CHILDREN AND CAREGIVERS SUPPORT

79,876 (14% Lebanese, 86% Refugees)

- 1,036 at-risk adolescents received life skills, psychosocial support, protection services. (21% Lebanese, 79% Refugees)
- 2,311 mother child activities conducted within community-based centres and through outreach. (16% Lebanese, 84% Refugees)
- 13,955 caregivers attended parenting classes. (16% Lebanese, 84% Refugees)
- 38,693 children benefited from support to family support networks that set up child friendly spaces. (14% Lebanese, 86% Refugees)
- 16,683 women and girls reached with community outreach and awareness activities on Gender Based Violence (GBV). (14% Lebanese, 86% Refugees)
- 7,198 children provided with psychosocial support. (7% Lebanese, 93% Refugees)

CASE MANAGEMENT

7,470 (17% Lebanese, 83% Refugees)

- 1,769 persons received vocational training. (70% Syrian, 30% non- Syrian)
- 300 persons received life-skills training. (66% Syrian, 34% non-Syrian)
- 3,743 Syrian and non-Syrian received assistance through psychosocial support activities.
- 7,197 child protection cases identified by the deployed and capacitated field workers. (26) (17% Lebanese, 83% Refugees)
- 273 women, adolescent girls escaping violence and their accompanying children were supported. (Not disaggregated)
- 230 Syrian children (14-18 years old) associated with armed conflict and violence received rehabilitation training and psycho-social support.

TRAINING OF SERVICE PROVIDERS

2,081

- 116 service providers trained on child-care services. (36% Lebanese, 64% Refugees)
- 1,758 child protection and GBV front line workers and service providers trained on identification and referral of women and children in the target areas. (Not disaggregated)
- 207 child protection actors trained on working with women survivors of GBV and good practices in casework with women and families. (75% Lebanese, 25% Refugees - data AI 2015)

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

- 52 MoSA staff trained on protection.
- Host communities coordinator deployed at MoSA.
- 49 Staff seconded to MoSA – social workers, field coordinators, programme managers and assistants, protection officer.
- 22 field workers recruited to support MoSA to lead and respond to GBV.
- 26 Social Development Centres (SDCs) in place and operational to address specific child-care needs and vulnerabilities in targeted areas.
- Updated Vocational Training Programmes within 4 Social Development Centres of the MoSA (Minnieh, Bourj Hammoud, Saida and Baalbeck) targeting both vulnerable youth and women from the database of the National Poverty Targeting Programme (NPTP).
- Establishment of the “National Plan to Safeguard Children and Women in Lebanon.”
- Development of the “Standard Operating Procedures for the protection of juveniles” (SOPs) in Lebanon aiming at strengthening the protection system in Lebanon on the basis of Law 422/2002 (protection of juveniles in conflict with law and/or at risk).
